

Statement of Faith

Disciple the Nations (DTN) recognizes that ours is a historic faith. We have a great affection for the labors of those who have gone before and have painstakingly written down the specifics of the Scripture's teaching on doctrinal issues. We thank God for the creeds and confessions of the past whose doctrines clearly and accurately expound the word of God, such as the expressions found in the <u>Apostles' Creed</u>, the <u>Athanasian Creed</u>, and the <u>Nicene Creed</u>, as well as the more modern, faithful, evangelical creeds, such as the <u>1853 New Hampshire Confession</u>. These creeds are in no way above or equal to the Bible, but are valuable to us as instruments of edification and instruction.

DTN is committed to presenting a biblical theology, doctrine, and vision of missions and ministry that is in harmony with the Scriptures. The following statement of faith reflects the doctrinal beliefs and convictions of Disciple the Nations. Every individual member of our Board of Directors, administration, staff, missionary personnel, and volunteer team must affirm this statement. Churches that join the DTN Church Network will also affirm this statement.

SCRIPTURE

The Bible, composed of the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments, is the infallible, inerrant, and inspired Word of God and has been sovereignly preserved throughout the ages¹. The Scriptures give us a fuller revelation of the nature and character of God, His purpose for the redemption of mankind², and His mission for the church³, and is the ultimate, sufficient, and final authority for all things that pertain to faith and practice⁴.

THE TRIUNE GOD

There is one true and living God¹. He is spirit, light, and love². In the unity of the Godhead subsist three Persons equal in divine essence, perfection, power, and glory³: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit⁴. The three Persons execute distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption⁵.

GOD THE FATHER

Our God is the uncreated, uncaused, self-sufficient Maker and supreme Ruler of heaven and earth¹. He is infinite, eternal, and unchangeable in all His attributes². Our God is holy, gracious, just, and righteous³. He is inexpressibly glorious and worthy of all honor and praise⁴. He is sovereign over all and nothing can hinder Him from accomplishing His plan⁵.

JESUS CHRIST

Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God and second person of the Godhead, is truly God and truly man¹. In the incarnation, Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary². He lived a sinless life and became accursed in the place of sinners on the cross, where He paid the price for salvation for all who believe³. He died, was buried, and on the third day, He arose bodily from the dead. He ascended into heaven where He intercedes for His church at the right hand of the Father⁴. Jesus will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead⁵. He is the only Mediator between God and man⁶. His kingdom will never end⁷.

THE HOLY SPIRIT

The fully divine, eternal Holy Spirit, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, is the third person of the Godhead¹. He convicts men of sin and effects regeneration for God's people². At regeneration, He baptizes the believer into the body of Christ and seals them unto the day of redemption³. He indwells believers and sanctifies them for godly living and service⁴. His ministry is to exalt and glorify the Lord Jesus Christ⁵.

CREATION

God created from nothing the heavens and the earth and all that is in them¹. He upholds the universe by the word of His power². All creation, including mankind, was made for His glory and He actively governs all creation according to His holy and wise providence³.

MANKIND

God created man male and female. Man was created in the image of God and in a sinless state¹. The first man, Adam, voluntarily sinned and fell from his sinless condition and incurred physical and spiritual death². Consequently, all men are born into a state of sin and are sinners, not only by constraint, but by choice, and are therefore under God's just wrath and condemnation and deserve eternal death as the punishment for their sin. Man, in his sinful nature, is spiritually dead, utterly depraved, and in need of a savior³.

SALVATION

According to the inerrant revelation of God's truth, which is found in the Scriptures alone, salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, to the glory of God alone.

Because of man's sin, there is no hope for salvation on the basis of human merit or works¹. In order for man to be saved and reconciled to God, atonement must be made for sin². Jesus, by His perfect obedience to God in His sinless life and by His suffering, death on the cross, and resurrection, made full atonement for the sins of God's people³. His righteousness is imputed to all believers, securing full redemption (justification, adoption, sanctification, preservation, and glorification) for all who repent of their sins and trust in Him alone for salvation⁴.

THE CHURCH

There is one universal, invisible Church, of which Christ is the Head¹. God's people are called to unite with a visible, local body of baptized believers that submits to the authority of Scripture, preaches the gospel of Jesus Christ, administers the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper, and exercises biblical government and discipline². The local church is the ordinary means of edifying God's people in Christ and spreading the gospel of God's kingdom to the ends of the earth³.
